The focus of this conference is on alcohol, the impact it can have on children and families, and the responses required to effectively and safely meet this client group's needs.

It is estimated that 1.1 million people are dependent drinkers and over 1.3 million children are living with families where alcohol dependency is present. We can only estimate the numbers of partners, grandparents and other family members and friends who are affected by problem drinking.

The co-occurrence between domestic violence and alcohol misuse is high and remains an important topic for practitioners to understand and know how to tackle when working with families. All these issues can pose dilemmas for anyone working with children and with families.
